Welcome Remarks



Introduction of AsCNP

The Asian College of Neuropsychopharmacology (AsCNP) was founded on October 1, 2008 in Tokyo after many enthusiastic discussions in several preparatory meetings. The mission of AsCNP is to encourage research, to facilitate communication of ideas in the convergent disciplines of neuropsychopharmacology in Asia, to make an innovation and development of pharmacotherapy in the treatment for psychiatric disorders, to provide education and training opportunities and to empower the patients and their families with professional knowledge.

The International College of Neuropsychopharmacology (CINP) founded in 1957 has been a leading international organization and made a large contribution to the development of neuropsychopharmacology globally in research as well as education. Subsequently the American College of Neuropsychopharmacology (ACNP) and the European College of Neuropsychopharmacology (ECNP) have been established in 1961 and 1987, respectively. In Asia, a huge number of patients are suffering from psychiatric disorders, and the prevalence of mental health problems such as depression, suicide, alcohol and substance abuse and dementia from children to elders increasing, therefore the AsCNP has been expected to be founded for many years.

Under Professor Shigeto Yamawaki, Founding President, the first AsCNP Congress was held in Kyoto, Japan on November 13-14, 2009. Under Professor Young Hoon Kim, the 2nd AsCNP President, 2nd AsCNP Congress was held in Seoul, Korea on September 23-24, 2011. Under Professor Xin Yu, the 3rd AsCNP President, the 3rd AsCNP Congress was held in Beijing, China on September 12-14, 2013. All of these congresses were very successful with fruitful discussion and communication.

The AsCNP has been recognized so rapidly. The ACNP Presidents have organized the leadership meetings of CINP/ACNP/ECNP/AsCNP in 2010, 2011, 2012, 2013, and 2014 and requested AsCNP delegates to introduce the AsCNP activity every year.

The 4th AsCNP Congress will be held jointly with World Psychiatry Association in Taipei, Taiwan on November 21-22, 2015 under Professor Tung-Ping Tom Su, AsCNP President-elect. The 5th AsCNP Congress will be held in Bali, Indonesia on September 28-30, 2017 under Professor Andi J Tanra.


