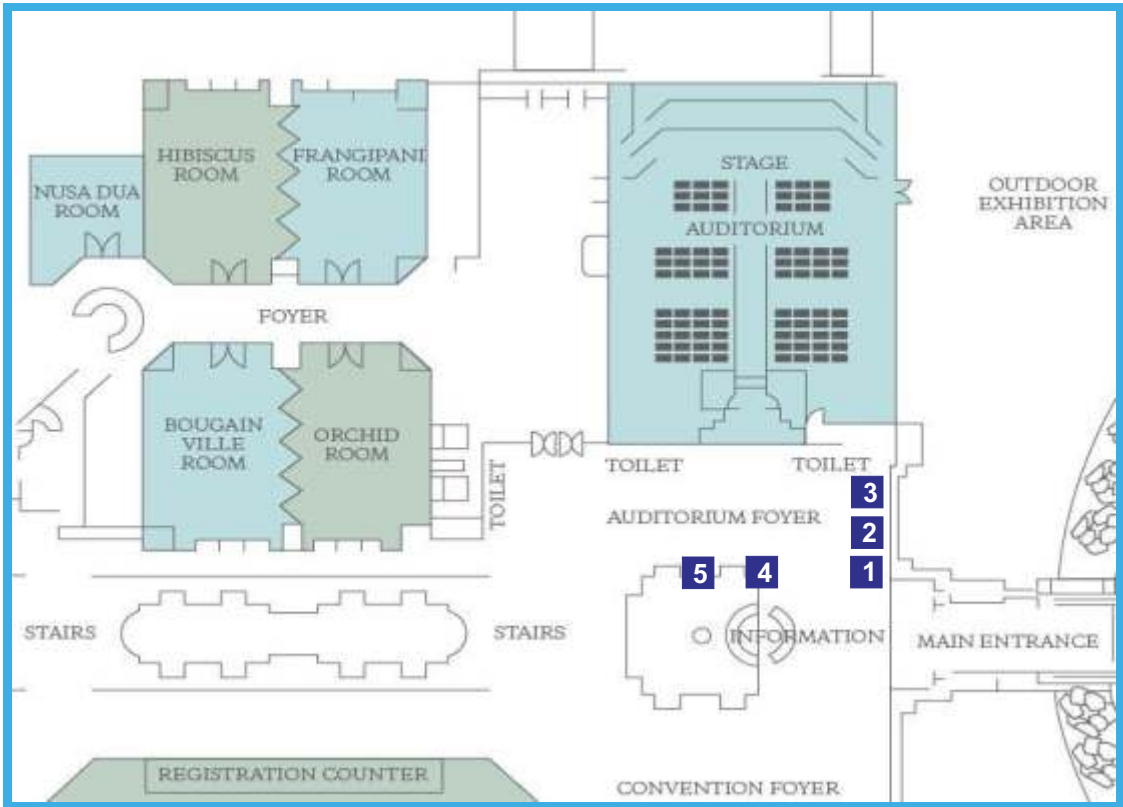

## Kuta Beach

This beach is known because of its beauty. You can see hills surround the beach. It has white sands and perfect wave for surfing. This beautiful beach offers everything. Location: **Kuta** ( $\pm 14$  KM from BICC)



## Kuta Art Market

Kuta Art Market remains an important part of Kuta's history, and still plays a major role as one of Kuta's landmarks and the longstanding traditional art market in the area. Location: **Kuta** ( $\pm 13.6$  KM from BICC)



## Kintamani & Mount Batur

Kintamani is home to Mount Batur and the Caldera Lake. The still-active Mount Batur volcano has erupted about 24 times since 1800, each time reshaping the surrounding landscape. Location: **Denpasar** ( $\pm 24.6$  KM from BICC)



## Bali Safari & Marine Park

It is Bali's largest animal theme park. The park is home to over 60 species, all roaming freely within their enclosures built to closely mimic their natural habitats. Location: **Gianyar** ( $\pm 38.4$  KM from BICC)
